

Consciousness Raising Group at MoM

In the 1960s and 70s, women met in small groups of 5-7 to develop a commonality of understanding by sharing regularly on the topic of agreed-upon themes in a process called go-round.

Beginning the first week of January MoM will conduct a consciousness-raising group using this technique of the second wave. The topics will be agreed upon at the first meeting but drawn from the lists available online (which you are encouraged to read to further educate yourselves).

We ask: what is your understanding of consciousness-raising and why do you want to participate in such a group; when did you first become aware of feminism; when did you first become aware of the differences between the sexes; when did you first experience discrimination on account of being a woman; what was your first sexual experience; what is your relationship to your body; marriage; relation to mothers and motherhood; abortion; holidays; aging; religion; intersectionality; independence; work; lesbianism; power; experiences in movements for social change; and art.
